Policy Statements:

1. Nominations

- 1.1 Nominees for Members-at-Large must have been a member of the union for at least one year immediately prior to the election.
- 1.2 Verbal or written nominations are accepted. Nominees do not need to be present at the election provided a written acceptance of the nomination is submitted.
- 1.3 Nominees shall disclose to the delegates any known reason why they would be unable to fulfil the duties of the position.

2. Elections

- 2.1 Members-at-Large are elected by the Regional Meeting delegates from their region.
- 2.2 All Regions elect at least two Members-at-Large and Alternates based on the entitlement prescribed by the Constitution.
- 2.3 Member-at-Large entitlement remains the same for the duration of the two-year term.
- 2.4 A region's Members-at-Large must be elected from at least two different chapters.
- 2.5 Each region elects one Member-at-Large to the Resolutions Committee.
- 2.6 Members-at-Large elected at Regional Meetings take office at the closure of the following Annual Convention.

3. Term

3.1 Members-at-Large are elected for a two-year term.

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3.2 Members-at-Large are elected to the Resolutions Committee for a two-year term.

4. Member-at-Large Participation

- 4.1 Members-at-Large are selected to participate:
 - on standing and special committees;
 - as a delegate to HSA Regional Meetings;
 - as a delegate to the annual HSA Convention; and
 - as a delegate to BC Federation of Labour conventions.
- 4.2 Members-at-Large selected to committees are expected to attend every meeting unless there is a compelling reason for missing a meeting.
- 4.3 The Member-at-Large elected to the Resolutions Committee is expected to attend the BC Federation of Labour's Policy and Constitutional Conventions.

Reason for Policy:

Members-at-Large are an important part of the HSA governance structure through their work on various committees. The role of Member-at-Large strengthens the relationship between the regions and the HSA head office.

Members-at-Large are elected to participate in HSA committee work and to represent their region at various events. Members-at-Large are expected to attend all meetings to ensure the work of the committee can progress and to represent their regions at meetings and events.

Typically, Member-at-Large elections take place at Fall Regional Meetings. There may be unusual circumstances that result in elections taking place at another time within the 12-month period prior to the appropriate Convention.

HSA is committed to a fair and inclusive election process that allows the membership to elect a pool of regional activists who are interested in participating in the governance of the Union.

Procedures:

1. Roles of the Regional Director in Member-at-Large Elections

- 1.1 Notice of the Members-at-Large elections is sent to the Regional Directors and Chief Stewards as part of the information about Regional Meetings.
- 1.2 The Election Committee provides each Regional Director with an election information package for their region. The information package includes a description of the duties of Members-at-Large to be discussed with the delegates to the Regional Meeting.
- 1.3 The Regional Director, or designate, conducts the Regional Elections and reminds delegates which ballots are to be used for these elections.
- 1.4 The Regional Director designates another member to conduct the elections if the Regional Director is seeking nomination for one of the positions.
- 1.5 Upon completion of the election, the Regional Director completes the election forms and returns them to the Chair of the Elections Committee along with the used ballots.
- 1.6 The Regional Director votes in the regional elections.
- 1.7 Any issues not covered by these guidelines are referred to the HSA Elections Committee.

2. Timing of Member-at-Large Elections

- 2.1 Regions 1, 3, 5, 7, and 9 conduct Member-at-Large elections at regional meetings within the 12-month period prior to the Convention held in odd-numbered years.
- 2.2 Regions 2, 4, 6, 8, and 10 conduct Member-at-Large elections at regional meetings within the 12-month period prior to the Convention held in even-numbered years.
- 2.3 Member-at-Large entitlement is determined 60 days prior to the election.

3. Nominations for Member-at-Large

- 3.1 Regions nominate at least their entitled number of Members-at-Large, plus additional members equal to the number of Alternates.
- 3.2 Members who will not be present at the Regional Meeting may submit to the Regional Director a letter of intent to stand for election as Member-At-Large. The

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- Regional Director will inform delegates at the Regional Meeting of the nomination.
- 3.3 Nominees are given an opportunity to address the delegates to the Regional Meeting. The Regional Director or designate will read any written submissions from nominees who are not present.
- 3.4 While addressing the delegates, nominees shall disclose any known reason why they would be unable to fulfil the duties of the position.

4. Balloting

- 4.1 Delegates at Regional Meetings must list the same number of names on their ballot as the number of Members-at-Large to which their region is entitled. Ballots with less than the required number of names are declared spoiled and are not included in the count.
- 4.2 The candidates with the highest number of votes to fill the Member-at-Large entitlement are elected as Members-at-Large. The candidate ranking next is determined to be the Alternate.
- 4.3 In the event that the elected Members-at-Large are not from at least two different chapters, the member from the over-represented chapter with the fewest votes becomes the alternate and the alternate becomes the Member-at-Large.
- 4.4 If the alternate is also from the over-represented chapter, he or she is dropped off the list and the member with the highest number of votes from a different chapter becomes the Member-at-Large.
- 4.5 In the event of a tie vote, a run-off vote is held for the "tied" candidates. If a second tie vote results, the outcome will be decided by lottery conducted by the Regional Director or designate in charge of the election.

5. Election to the Resolutions Committee

5.1 From the elected MALs delegates will then elect the MAL who will serve a twoyear term on the Resolutions Committee.

6. Vacancies

6.1 In case of vacancies, the alternate Member-At-Large fills the vacancy for the remainder of the term. If a vacant Member-At-Large position is not filled, an election is held at the next Regional Meeting.

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7. Member-At-Large Participation

- 7.1 A Member-at-Large participates in HSA committees, Regional Meetings, HSA's annual Convention, and the BC Federation of Labour convention, and reports on their activities to their region.
- 7.2 A Member-at-Large notifies the Committee Chair in advance if unable to attend a meeting or event.
- 7.3 A Member-at-Large notifies the Regional Director in advance if unable to attend a Regional Meeting or event.
- 7.4 If a Member-at-Large misses a committee meeting without a compelling reason, the Chair of the Committee may recommend to the Board of Directors that the Member-at-Large be replaced on that committee.
- 7.5 Regional Directors canvass Members-at-Large regarding their interest in attending the B.C. Federation of Labour Policy Convention. If more than one Member-at-Large is interested in attending, the Regional Director selects the delegate by lottery.

8. Committee Assignments

- 8.1 Each Member-at-Large completes a "committee interest" form indicating interest in specific committees and reason for interest.
- 8.2 The Board appoints Members-at-Large to committees and considers the following factors when making appointments:
 - interests of individual Members-at-Large
 - regional equity
 - background of the individual
 - previous committee positions
 - continuity of representation

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
