Eligibility and Instructions:

- 1. Applicants must be an HSA member in good standing, or the child (aged 28 or younger) of an HSA member, who is continuing or proceeding to a full-time or part-time program of studies in any field leading to a recognized certificate, diploma, or degree at a public post-secondary educational institution.
- 2. Twenty \$2000.00 full-time and four \$1000.00 part-time bursaries will be awarded. The Education Committee ranks applications based on financial need, the personal statement, and a written statement about unions.
- 3. Awards must be claimed by November 30th in the year in which they are awarded. Previous HSA scholarship or bursary winners are ineligible.
- 4. Applications must be completed in full. Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.
- 5. Generative Artificial Intelligence (AI) submissions will not be accepted.
- Please send one email that includes your application to <u>BursaryScholarshipApplication@hsabc.org</u>.
 Applications may be mailed if electronic submission is not possible.
- 7. Applications must be received by the HSA office or post-marked by Friday, January 9, 2026 at 11:59pm to be considered. Funds will be awarded upon verification of registration and attendance in the course/program.
- 8. All financial information will be kept in confidence in accordance with the Personal Information Protection Act.
