Revised: October, 2020 Eligibility and Instructions:

- Applicants must be a member in good standing of HSA or be the child (aged 25 or younger) of an HSA member, who is continuing or proceeding to a full-time or part-time program of studies in any field leading to a recognized certification, degree or diploma.
   In addition, HSA members are eligible to apply for part-time bursaries.
- 2. Twenty \$1500 full-time and four \$750 part-time bursaries will be awarded. This is a competition, and the Education Committee ranks applications based on financial need, the personal statement, and an essay about unions.
- 3. Awards must be claimed by November 30th in the year in which they are awarded. Previous HSA scholarship or bursary winners are ineligible.
- 4. Please send one email that includes your application to **education@hsabc.org**. Applications may be mailed if electronic submission is not possible.
- 5. Applications must be completed in full.
- 6. Applications must be received by the HSA office or post-marked **by January 21, 2022 by 11:59 pm** to be considered. Funds will be awarded upon verification of registration and attendance in the course/program.
- 7. All financial information will be kept in confidence in accordance with the Personal Information Protection Act.

The Education Committee scores part A and B of the personal statement using a two-point, four-level rubric for each question. The rubric is found at the end of this document.
